1st Grade Curriculum

Bible

Students learn that God has a purpose for His people, which continues throughout history. The main emphasis is on the Old Testament, yet briefly discusses Christ's life. Students learn memory verses.

Saxon Math

The Saxon 2 math curriculum includes addition, subtraction, introduction To multiplication (0-5's), story problems, telling time to the minute, counting by 1, 2, 5, 10, counting money, calendar, etc.

Language Arts

The phonics reading program includes writing skills, reading, and spelling. Emphasis is on the correct formation of letters, proper pronunciation of letter and blend sounds, spelling by combining letter sounds and reading phonetically. Students read literature books such as *Curious George* and *Frog and Toad are Friends*.

Grammar

The Shurley Grammar curriculum includes usage of jingles, chanting, and a question and answer flow that teaches students to identify parts of speech such as nouns, verbs, adverbs, adjectives, and articles.

Geography

Students learn of various landforms in Georgia and throughout the world. Students study continents and oceans, as well as American and the State of Georgia symbols such as the flag and the bald eagle. They read 12 biographies about famous Americans -George Washington, Betsy Ross, and Helen Keller.

Science

The science program starts students on the path of scientific inquiry with an introduction to the senses, heat, sound, animals, and human bodies – representing God as the Creator of all things. Instruction includes the use of pattern recognition, games, discussion, and hands-on student activities. They read 6 life cycle books about animals such as frogs and butterflies.

Art

Students discover the elements of art as they work on two dimensional and three dimensional projects.

<u>Music</u>

The music program encourages students in their singing while it also recognizes attributes of God and how singing is a form of praise.

Physical Education

The physical education program helps students develop their gross motor skills, learn game skills, and grow in their understanding of honoring God in athletic competition.



Computer Lab

They play computer games to enrich their math lessons. They type Their spelling words and make Word Finds to help them remember how to spell their words.
