2nd Grade Curriculum

Bible

Students review Creation to the exile from Jerusalem. Jesus' life and teachings are studied including the parables and Lord's Prayer. They also study a unit on Christian living based on the Book of James. Students learn memory verses.

Saxon Math

Saxon 3 math curriculum includes mentally solving 1-12 addition, subtraction and multiplication problems, solving word problems with three and four steps, counting money, telling time, introduction to division, etc.

Language Arts

The intensive phonics approach includes phonics workbooks, penmanship and phonics-based spelling. Students read literature books such as *The Boxcar Children* and *Little House on the Prairie. 3*. Writing activities are integrated across the curriculum.

Grammar

The Shurley Grammar curriculum emphasizes jingles, chanting and a question and answer flow that helps students to identify parts of speech.

Writing

The writing curriculum includes poetry, creative writing, 1 - 3 paragraph essays, learning to write from an outline and learning to write from research.

History

The curriculum focuses on Old Testament and Ancient Egyptian history. Students learn about the important people, dates, and events of the time.

Art

Students discover the elements of art as they work on two dimensional and three-dimensional projects.

Geography

Curriculum is integrated with history and includes the teaching of various landforms. Students learn about oceans, continents, Georgia and surrounding states, maps, graphs, compass, etc.

Science

The science program presents God's earth and His creation clearly as the students study plants, animals and their habitats, light and energy, the human body, and the ocean.

Music

The music program within the classroom encourages students in their singing and worship.

Physical Education

The physical education program helps students develop their gross motor skills, learn game skills, and grow in their understanding of honoring God in athletic competition.
